



Nurse Assistant-Certified



Program Description:

This program is designed to prepare students for employment as a Nurse Assistant in a variety of settings. Students will learn patient care, observation and communication skills with an emphasis on caring for the geriatric resident in a long-term care facility. The program prepares students to be successful in the work place by teaching employability skills and modeling workplace expectations. The program includes both classroom instruction (theory) and 100 clinical hours. Due to COVID the program will be taught via Distance Learning. Students however may be called back to in-person classes/clinical if the state requires it.

This program is articulated with Chaffey College. Students meeting the requirements will earn college credit. In order to receive the articulated units a student must pass the program with a B or better and pass both sections of the state exam.

Program Prerequisites:

Basic reading test required unless you have a high school diploma or H.S equivalency. If you are attending an adult school program no testing required. Call for testing appointment. Testing is free.

Students are required to attend all class/clinical sessions as scheduled. During COVID students will participate in distance learning but must follow **set schedule**.

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Program Requirements:

- Maintain a minimum of 70% grade average and 93% attendance
- Must be able to perform job functions (physical and sensory demands)
- Must be able to clear a criminal background check (Live Scan). CDPH makes the final approval of Certification. For questions please refer to www.cdph.ca.gov
- Clinical site training (at least 100 hours) is a requirement of this program. (During COVID-19 Pandemic clinical may be offered via simulation/distance learning)
- Upon completion of the program, students should possess a willingness to secure employment.

Enrollment Process:

Step 1. Contact Registration Staff at 909-793-3115 ext. 522 or go to website at cryop.org, to Adult Students, to Programs, to Adult Program Interest Form and complete. Registration staff will call and/or email you to answer questions.

Step 2. Complete registration information that is emailed to you and schedule an appointment to meet in person with registration staff.

Step 3: Meet in person at the site to complete the enrollment process (Bring legal ID, Proof of diploma or HS Equivalency (not required) & original social security card.

Step 4: First 2 weeks of school submit Physical Examination (Required form available in Registration Dept.)
