

# Nurse Assistant - Acute Care



## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Nurse Assistant –Acute Care is designed to prepare students who are Certified Nursing Assistants for employment in the acute care setting. Students will learn reinforcement of CNA skills, with special emphasis on specialized acute care areas such as medical, surgical, orthopedic, pediatric, and obstetrical units. Integrated throughout the class are career preparation standards that include basic academic skills, interpersonal skills, problem solving, safety, and technology. Clinical worksite learning is a required component of the program.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Must show proof of passing current CNA State Certification exam.
- Must show proof of earning a B– or better in the Nursing Assistant Program or 1 year of experience working as a Certified Nursing Assistant.
- Current proof of Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers certification required. Original BLS CPR card must be presented to Student Services staff prior to the start of the program.
- Worksite learning is a required component of the program. Specific hours and attendance required. Students must maintain a grade of C+ or better in the program to participate in worksite learning.
- Uniform required (scrubs). Not included in program costs. Specific color requirements: Black Bottoms and Top blue shade called CIEL or CIEW. Uniforms are available for purchase at the school.
- Negative TB screening, seasonal flu vaccination, COVID-19 vaccination or signed declination for religious or medical reasons only, and physical exam not older than one year are required.
